The quote I opened our time together with is from Brazilian author Paulo Coelho – I will just repeat it now:

Always ask yourself if what you're doing today is getting you closer to where you want to be tomorrow.

I think this is good advice. It is so easy to coast along on autopilot for miles. Having dedicated time to check-in with ourselves, our relationships, work and even our church community is healthy. It keeps things relevant – are we doing what we want with our time, our resources etc.

We are the authors of our stories, we are this church, this community. In April we reflected on what we saw our church's purpose being.

Let us know consider how we the church is achieving that purpose for us.

There are post-it notes on the tables and pens for those of you in church, for those of you in church, please use the chat-box or I will pop my email address into the box in a second and you can email me direct.

We will now have a few minutes to jot down the following: -

- What is serving you?
- What is not serving you?

Another way of phrasing it could be what is working for you or what makes your soul sing – however you phrase it, what is working for you as a vital part of this community. There is no right or wrong answer.

I will let you know when we are half-way through so you can ensure you spend time on each question.

Would anyone like to share their thoughts?

We are well into the season of growth – you will have no doubt noticed the luscious greenery appearing in abundance this month.

This will continue throughout the summer and hopefully having this service today may encourage you to continue this activity too now that the seed has been planted.

You could reflect on other areas of your life – work, exercise, diet, hobbies – all can benefit from a bit of scrutiny every now and then. Just consider a particular aspect and ask yourself: Are you being served? It can be tough; we are of course creatures of habit and change can be daunting and challenging. I am certainly not going to tell you it isn't easy – but I will say, it is worth it.

Change is necessary and essential for growth – our time and life are precious. The world contains so much beauty and sources of joy, so find what feels good!

You may recall that our current 3-year-strategy includes the signpost *Increase Active Engagement* which includes to plan a programme of events whilst adopting a "rule of yes" for new initiatives. The "rule of yes" means that if you proposed an idea which fits our general ethos and you had help from others to run it then would be told yes to trialling it **and** could be offered £50 start-up costs if they were needed.

When I was reflecting on our celebrations to share at our annual meeting last month, I was inspired by all our community had accomplished. We do so many things for others whilst also having fun together during worship and social events. I believe there exists untapped potential and strength in our community. We all have something to offer and with support and encouragement I am sure we can continue to grow as a community. I would like us to plant seeds as a community for our community.

How would you like us to grow? Do you have any ideas or dreams for the church? Perhaps you have ideas about things we could do differently or events or activities we could introduce?

Maybe you have something you'd like to share, a hobby, skill or passion – maybe there is something the community used to do or that you'd like to see reintroduced. Together we achieve amazing things.

Please now jot down anything your heart suggests – it can be a small thing or something outlandish, if we don't plant the seed, it isn't likely to grow.
