Love, peace, and beauty! Don't they go well together? The three together form our highest emotions. As I have found out they are very difficult to separate, if not impossible. Throughout this service you will see how they are so intertwined starting with this from Muinuddin Chishti, A 13th century humanitarian:

Love all and hate none. Mere talk of peace will avail you naught.

Mere talk of God and religion will not take you far.

Bring out all of the latent powers of your being

and reveal the full magnificence of your immortal self.

Be surcharged with peace and joy,

and scatter these wherever you are and wherever you go.

Be a blazing fire of truth, be a beauteous blossom of love,

and be a soothing balm of peace.

With your spiritual light, dispel the darkness of ignorance.

Dissolve the clouds of discord and war, and spread goodwill, peace and harmony among the people.

When love works its magic there is harmony and peace and everything around becomes that much more beautiful. You could say that:

Love is action; Action is knowledge; Knowledge is truth; Truth is love.

We start with love.

LOVE IS

Love is blue and red and yellow

We know reality through love, and love is that reality. Love is an attracting and creative force that holds the whole universe together and just as we have organs to pick up smells, taste, sound and light, we have an organ that picks up that energy we call love. That organ, of course, is the heart. Love permeates all of our senses; we love a beautiful view, a work of art, music, the smell and taste of food. Love attracts us to others and others to us. Without love life would not be worth living.

To the one who knows what it means, love means patience, love means endurance, love means tolerance, love means sacrifice, love means service. All things such as gentleness, humility, modesty, graciousness, kindness, all are the different manifestations of love. It is the same as to say,

'Love is all and all is love.' And it is to find it, to feel it, to experience its warmth, and to see in the world, the light of love, and to keep its glow, and to hold love's flame high, as the sacred torch, to guide one in life's journey. It is in this that the purpose of life is fulfilled.

Unconditional Love is most sacred. To utter the word love without meaning it is a vain repetition. The lips of a person to whom it means something, are closed. They can say little. For love is a revelation in itself. No study is necessary, no meditation is needed, and no piety is required. If love is pure, if the spark of love has begun to

glow, then there is no need to go somewhere to gain love. Then love is within. One must keep blowing the spark till it turns into a perpetual fire. The fire worshippers of old did not worship a fire which went out; they worshipped a perpetual fire. Where is that perpetual fire to be found? In one's heart.

Self-knowledge is the real wisdom – Vedanta.

The kingdom of God is within you – Bible.

He who knows himself knows God - Koran

Knowledge without love and service is useless. Love must be without conditions.

You cannot know love by reading about it, just as you cannot fully understand the depths of love by it being described to you.

It is what's in the heart that is important, not outward appearances.

Love is what is present when there is no object-subject, when there are not two.

Love is not causal. You cannot create love, you cannot practise love and it cannot be taught.

We find love through the inner yearning of the heart. It is the inner yearning of the heart that has kept me on the spiritual path.)

It is said that God is love, and that love is in our heart. This is because this is where we first feel the pangs of love. You have to start by loving life and then yourself. You cannot expect someone else to love you if you do not love yourself. Despite what some say you are not unique. You are part of a community. By loving life and yourself for what you are, brings harmony and beauty.

It is not who or what you pray to, or whether you pray at all, it is what's in your heart that counts. There are two aspects to love; service and passion. Service, giving your life to the service of others, welcoming to all.

What stops us from welcoming to all? The word my, my family, my country, my team, my religion. Mine infers a yours; mine is better than yours.

We need to remove I, me and mine which separates us from others, nature and life. This is best done with loving kindness. With true loving kindness we are no longer thinking of ourselves. If we remove I, me and mine and all the baggage we carry around in our mind, what do we have left, intuition and inspiration. All rivers, whether they flow to the east or to the west, have arisen from the sea and will return to it again. Yet once these rivers have merged with the sea they no longer think "I am this river", "I am that river". In the same way, my son, all these creatures, when they merge again with Being, do not remember that they originally arose from being and wound their individual ways through life.~ *Chandogya Upanishad*

Passion goes together with creativity. All the great artists were passionate about what they were doing; they did not start wars; they did not fight each other; they appreciated other people's art and tolerated that which they were not drawn to. Peace, beauty and creativity comes from freedom; freedom from dogma; freedom from the veils that bind us.

When people prefer the love of money, status or promotion it often goes wrong because it is one sided. Money does not return that love. Unconditional love requires two people being attracted to each other. When it is one sided it leads to misery. Loving someone who does not respond can lead to desperation.

I would like now to give you the first part of a practice that, if done regularly, could change your life. It is very simple; all you have to do is take three very slow breaths in and out with intention. As you breath in feel that you are breathing in **love**; then on the out breath feel **compassion** radiating from your heart and reaching everyone in the church.
